Tell your children the words Jesus said to his apostles in the Garden of Gethsemane when he asked the apostles if they could not stay awake and pray with him. Visit the Blessed Sacrament during Lent as part of family Lenten prayer. Remind the children of Jesus' words at the Last Supper when he asked his disciples to remember him by eating His Body and drinking His Blood. Refer to him as the Bread of Life and develop the concept of the importance of spiritual food in our lives.
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
