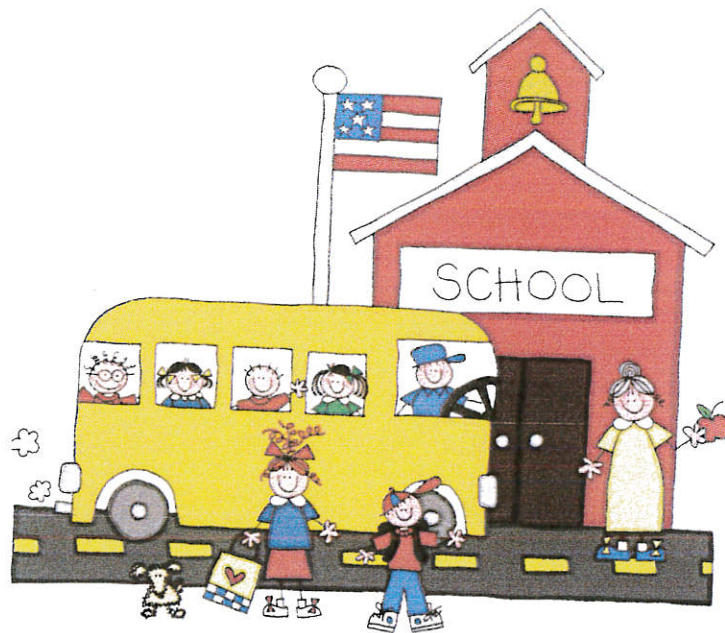
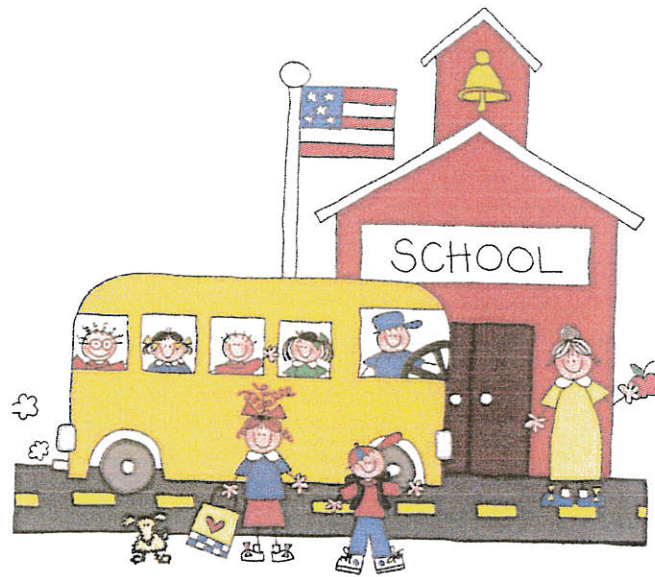


# Let's Get Ready for Kindergarten

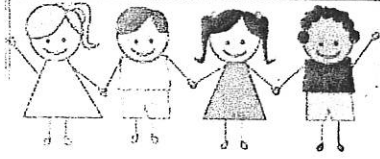


Dear Parents,
